Home Industries Schedule

- All entries to be on official entry form (see website).
- All entries to be grown, made or created by the **named** exhibitor unless otherwise stated.
- At time of entry, all entrants must be a permanent resident of Western Bay of Plenty.
- Presentation of awards will be at **3pm on Show Day**.
- Entries, Cups, Trophies and Awards must remain in the hall until **3.30pm** of the Show Day.
- Judging will take place prior to show day.
- Presentation is all part of Judging. The judges will cut, open and taste entries. Judges do not have to award prizes unless exhibits have met the required standard.
- Judge's decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- A maximum of **1 entry** by one individual exhibitor **per category except where otherwise stated**.
- All entries and prize money **MUST** be collected between 3.30pm and 5pm on Show Day.
- Any entries or prize money not collected by 5pm will become the property of the Katikati A&P Society who will dispose of the items as the Society deems fit.
- All schedule tips and recommendations will be published on Katikati A&P Website, Home Industries
